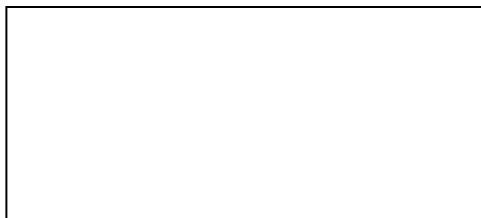

***Exceptions:** If you cannot obtain a visa for the semester indicated on your Certificate of Eligibility for Non-Immigrant Student/Form I-20 A-B, you will be granted a period of deferment. If you take this option, you must inform Marywood University four weeks prior to the beginning of the semester for which you applied. If your application for a visa is rejected by the Embassy of the United States of America, you may apply for a refund of your advance deposit (less a service charge of \$25.00) by sending Marywood University the Certificate of Eligibility for Non-Immigrant Student/Form I-20 A-B and a letter certified by the Consulate Official of the United States Embassy.
